Dear Parents and Carers,



A warm welcome back for the Summer term. All of the children have turned up this week full of beans, keen to learn and looking forward to the warm weather.

We had our welcome back assembly on Tuesday and talked about our new Golden Rule focus – we listen carefully. I also completed some classroom visits to look at our routines and behaviours, which I shared with children. We were very proud of how the whole school listened to their teachers and engaged in discussion but we

agreed that this term we need to focus on how well we concentrate and put effort in when we are working independently on our activities. We agreed that I can come round more often to see this in action.

Spelling updates

Over the spring term, we focussed on embedding our Literacy Tree scheme for writing which has been an overwhelming success. The children and staff have responded brilliantly to the texts and we have seen fantastic progress across the school. As such, we have started the summer term in KS2 by also teaching spelling through the Literacy Tree scheme. This programme is linked to the book that is being read in class and focusses on teaching spelling patterns and words in context. As a staff team, we have decided that we will no longer be sending spelling lists home or carrying out weekly spelling tests. The reason for this is as there is little evidence to suggest that this has a long term impact on improving children's spelling. However, we will have spelling quizzes in class during the year which will be based on the age related spellings. We will also provide, through our class pages on the website, the year groups spelling lists. This is completely for your awareness, if you would like to use them at home to support children's writing at all.

For Key Stage One, from September, we want to make a clear distinction between phonics and spelling. In September, Robins and Year 1 will learn phonics through Little Wandle; Year 2 will move on to learning spellings through Literacy Tree. We will also continue to run Little Wandle phonics booster groups for those children who have gaps in their phonics knowledge.

I hope that this all makes sense but please do let me know if you have any further questions.


