<u>Latin</u>

At Gretton Primary School we have chosen to teach Latin in KS2, starting in the Autumn term 2024, because of the rich opportunities that come with learning this ancient language. As well as being a fascinating language in its own right, knowledge of Latin helps to <u>develop literacy skills</u>. Through Latin, children develop their <u>knowledge of spelling and vocabulary through learning Latin roots</u> of English words and deepen their understanding of grammar. Alongside language learning, the study of Roman and Greek civilisations aids <u>cultural literacy</u>, encourages cultural insights and gives opportunities for <u>wide-ranging thinking</u> across many linked subjects (including history, philosophy, art, maths and science).

Through our Latin curriculum we aim to ensure the pupils have the opportunity to meet the national curriculum requirements as follows:

Listen attentively to spoken language and show understanding by joining in and responding. Explore the patterns and sounds of language through songs and rhymes and link the spelling, sound and meaning of words.

Speak in sentences, using familiar vocabulary, phrases and basic language structures.

Read carefully and show understanding of words, phrases and simple writing.

Appreciate stories, songs, poems and rhymes in the language.

Broaden their vocabulary and develop their ability to understand new words that are introduced into familiar written material, including through using a dictionary.

Write phrases from memory and adapt these to create new sentences to express ideas clearly. Describe people, places, things and actions in writing.

Understand basic grammar appropriate to the language being studied, including (where relevant): feminine, masculine and neuter forms and the conjugation of high-frequency verbs; key features and patterns of the language; how to apply these, for instance, to build sentences; and how these differ from or are similar to English.

<u>Staffing</u>

As part of our preparation for the 2024/25 academic year, we are working on which class adults will be working in. As part of this development, we will be advertising a 3 day a week teaching position that you will see on the vacancy noticeboards. We will announce later in the term the plans for next academic year and where necessary will hold parent meetings to discuss.
