**Re: 2025 – 2026 TAs**

As we look ahead to the new academic year, I would like to take this opportunity to share some updates regarding our Teaching Assistant (TA) team, which will take effect from September 2025.

From September 2025, there will be some changes to our TA team. These include new roles and responsibilities, some internal staff movements, and the addition of a new team member. Mrs Claassens has been recruited and she comes with a wealth of experience both as a TA and as a qualified teacher. The changes we have made have been carefully planned to best meet the evolving needs of all of our pupils and to further enhance the support we provide across all year groups. Our TAs work with all of the pupils in each class throughout the week. Some of their time is spent supporting those pupils with SEND and those with an Education, Health and Care Plan.

The set-up from September 2025 will be as follows:

Robins

Mrs Woolston will continue to be the TA every morning.

Mrs Claassens will be supporting children in Robins and Kingfishers during the afternoons.

Kingfishers

Mrs Denham will continue to be the TA every morning.

Mrs Claassens will be supporting children in Robins and Kingfishers during the afternoons.

Owls

Mrs Fowler will move to Owls full time.

Mrs Claassens will be an additional TA in Owls and she will offer additional support in Owls every morning.

Eagles

Mrs Phillips will be the TA for 4 mornings a week.

Interventions and Additional targeted support

Mrs Denham and Mrs Phillips will also be delivering targeted support and interventions for 5 afternoons per week for children in all classes.

We are confident that these changes will strengthen our provision and continue to ensure that every child receives the attention and support they need to thrive.
